## Admission Policy

Applications are evaluated on the basis of depth and quality of academic preparation, ACT or SAT scores, the submitted writing sample, extra-curricular achievement, special talents and character. Successful candidates for admission will usually meet the following minimum criteria: a 2.7 GPA, ACT composite score of 20, and rank in the top half of the graduating class.

## Admission Procedures

To be considered for admission, a student needs to:

- 1 Complete and submit the application for admission. Online applications are available at [www.augie.edu](http://www.augie.edu). There is no fee to apply.
- 2 Send an official copy of your high school transcript (including rank in class)
- 3 Obtain one personal recommendation
- 4 Arrange for the results of the ACT or SAT to be sent to the College
5. Complete the essay question on the application or submit another writing sample.
