ACT Composite Score of 21 or above

OR

HS GPA of 2.6 on a 4.0 scale

AND

Earn a "C" average or higher grade point in the following required high school courses:

- 4 years of English
- 3 years of Advanced Mathematics*
- 3 years of Laboratory Science**
- 3 years of Social Studies
- 1 year of Fine Arts

*Advanced math includes algebra and above.

**Lab. Science includes biology, chemistry, physics or approved physical science or earth science
