### Admission Policy

Students should submit an application, as well as a transcript of their high school grades, GED results, and ACT scores. Some programs require preliminary entrance exams and/or a personal interview.

A \$15 application fee is required with the application form. This fee covers the costs of setting up the student files. Upon acceptance, a \$25 acceptance fee secures the applicant's position in the program. A \$125 tuition deposit is also due at this time. Many programs have a maximum number of students at any one time, so it is wise to enroll early to assure admission at the most desirable time.
